**Day -1**

**Date: 14.03.2022**

The camp was started on 14.03.2022 at Annangur Village and formally welcomed the dignitaries by Dr.R.Dhanasekaran, NSS Programme Officer. The inaugural speech was given by Dr.V.Radhakrishnan, the principal of KSRCAs, described the aim and objectives of NSS and mentioned the expectations from volunteers in the special camp. In his address, all the students should work sincerely and take up the responsibility for developing our society. Mr.R.Pachagoundan, NSS Programme Officer, delivered a special camp schedule of NSS activities to be conducted for 7 days.

Later Ms. A. Rajareshwari, NSS Programme Officer proposed vote of thanks at the end of the programme. In the afternoon session, Swacchta Hi Seva has been conducted in this village. Students were actively involved in cleaning the premises of Annangur village. After that, House to House survey was conducted across 234 houses covering 920 people. Majority of people were in the middle age, illiterates and belonged to lower middle socio-economic status. Most of the people were residing in semi





hut houses with inadequate lighting and ventilation. Common health problems detected during house to house visit were hypertension, diabetes, anemia, malnutrition and asthma.

He also presented a special note address on **Plastic Awareness** and how to avoid it in our day to life. But we also request our great guru to facilitate our clean city, Green City campaign, in which our main purpose is to urge the people to leave the use of plastic and environmentally friendly carry bags made of paper and jute Switch on.

We are constantly seeing how plastic is affecting our environment in many ways by accumulating in water bodies like oceans, rivers, lakes and canals. Also, we can see them dumping along the roadside while dumping looks really dirty. Rather than sharpening their use, people's dependency is increasing. Whether we go shopping or buy a small item from the store, we take everything in plastic bags, which are extremely disappointing. Needless to say, its use is growing on a large scale throughout the world.





Plastic is made of synthetic polymer, which contains many organic as well as inorganic compounds and usually derives from petrochemicals such as olefin. Plastic materials are classified mainly as thermoplastic (polyvinyl chloride and polystyrene) and thermosetting polymers (polystyrene). Apart from these, they can also be classified in engineering, biodegradable and elastomeric plastics. Although the plastics are quite useful in many ways and are largely an integral part of the polymer industry, their construction and disposal create a massive threat to all living forms on our planet Earth.

It is not known exactly how the plastic disintegrates; although it is believed that it requires hundreds and thousands of years. It is not only the manufacture of plastic which affects our environment, but the poison and fragments emitted at photo-decomposition seriously pollute both our water channels and the quality of the soil.

There are still some forms of plastic that quickly break down like we have Oxo-degrades. But when they become less conceivable, they still hover in the environment. For example, in the ocean environment, pieces of plastic are consumed by filter-feeding organisms. When small Plankton swallows the plastic, the animal in the food chain can actually store large amounts. Floating wastes in the form of plastics which can remain present in water for thousands of years, which act as transport of aggressive species, which harbor the development of habitats.

Due to the release of toxic chemicals (such as Biphenyl A, Stylin Trimmer, etc.) through the water in the plastic bodies, the quality of drinking water is rapidly deteriorating. These substances affect the quality of water which makes it ineligible to drink and when consumed it proves to be dangerous for life forms.

That is why it is high time that we say 'no' for the use of plastic bags and not only preserve life forms on our planet, but also our very natural living environment which makes our existence worth it.

**Programme title: Tuberculosis**

Tuberculosis is an infectious bacterial disease caused by Mycobacterium bacteria, which majorly affects the lungs of a person. World Tuberculosis Day was primarily observed in the year 1882 by Dr. Robert Koch who detected the cause of tuberculosis, the TB bacillus. He took the first step towards diagnosing and curing tuberculosis. According to WHO, the year 2005 holds the record of the largest number of new TB cases all across the South-East Asia, which was accountable for 34% of incident cases worldwide. In the year 2000-2015, 49 million lives were saved from TB through effective diagnosis and treatment.

**Day -6**

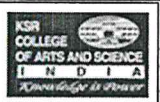
**Date: 19.03.2022**

While traveling on the road, you must have seen traffic police staff making gestures and whistling to direct the vehicles and pedestrians. Well, they risk their lives just to ensure that the rest of us can travel or walk safely on the road.

One of the basic traffic rules for pedestrians is to cross the roads only through zebra crossings when the traffic signal is red. However, you may often notice that people do not follow the traffic rules, and cross the roads wherever they find no vehicles approaching nearby. At times, pedestrians even slide through between the vehicles stuck in traffic signals for crossing the roads. This is one of the most common scenarios at places where there is no traffic police staff posted and during rush hours.

Also, nowadays there is another very common mistake that people make while walking on or crossing the roads, that is, they remain engrossed in their mobile phones. Even when they are not talking to someone over the phone, they are engaged in various apps or entertainment content on their smartphones. This makes them more prone to road accidents. Moreover, this is not only the case with the pedestrians, but the drivers also often happen to be busy on their phones while driving. While crossing a road, it is very important to look on your left-hand side and right-hand side, to check if any vehicle is approaching nearby.

Road safety does not only imply crossing the road through zebra crossing, but it also addresses the safety of those driving through the narrow roads of hilly areas and of those driving late nights on the highways. Some ill practices like drinking and driving have led to numerous road accidents in these areas. There are certain speed limits specified for particular areas, to reduce the chance of accidents. It is





of utmost importance to abide by the speed limits of a particular area as per the traffic rules. Sometimes, fatal accidents occur in the hilly areas due to fog, whereas sometimes, it is the carelessness of the drivers that lead to road accidents. People barely maintain the speed limits on the road when they are in a hurry. At times, those who drive trucks or Lorries carrying commodities in bulk, overnight meet with accidents. Due to sleepiness, they may miss important road signs. Also, there are several cases of road accidents that are caused due to the poor condition of roads.


Road safety can be ensured when you follow the traffic rules strictly and discard the ill practices like using phones while walking or driving on road, driving when drunk, following the specified speed limits, etc. I hope that I have covered all the important features of safety in my Sadak Suraksha speech.
